## Health Advisory:

[Severe Illness Associated with Using Non-Pharmaceutical Chloroquine Phosphate to Prevent and Treat Coronavirus Disease 2019 \(COVID-19\)](#)

Recommendations for the public:

1. **At this time, there are no available pharmaceutical products that are FDA-approved for the prevention or treatment of COVID-19.**
  2. Do not ingest aquarium-use products or any other chemicals that contain chloroquine phosphate. These chemicals are not intended for human consumption and can lead to serious health consequences, including death.
  3. Medications like chloroquine phosphate and hydroxychloroquine sulfate should be taken only when prescribed by and under the supervision of your healthcare provider and always according to the instructions provided.
  4. Seek immediate medical attention if you are experiencing any unexpected symptoms after taking chloroquine or hydroxychloroquine by contacting your healthcare provider or your poison center (1- 800-222-1222).
